






University of Minnesota

The Twin Cities offer a wealth of attractions for residents and visitors, including world-class museums, acclaimed theaters and concert halls, diverse restaurants, nearly 200 microbreweries, exciting sporting events, and the Mall of America.

Minneapolis is home to the Guthrie Theater, the Orpheum Theater, the Minneapolis Institute of Art, the Walker Art Center, and the Weisman Art Museum. In addition, there are four professional sports teams: Minnesota Twins Baseball (MLA), Timberwolves Basketball (NBA), Lynx Basketball (WNBA), and Vikings Football (NFL).

Saint Paul is home to the History Museum, the Science Museum, the Ordway Theater, and the Como Park Zoo and Conservatory. People can also visit the Wabasha Caves, where famous gangsters like John Dillinger hung out. Saint Paul is home to professional teams in the NHL (Minnesota Wild), PWHL (Minnesota Frost), and MLS (Minnesota United FC).
